

How Is The Hospital Liable For What The Nurse/Doctor Did?

This is a question that we get sometimes in our medical cases. Not only can this issue come up for doctors and nurses when dealing with hospitals, but it can come up any time there is an employer/employee relationship in which the employer can be held legally responsible for the actions of the employee acting within the scope of employment.



One of the Maryland doctrines which can sometimes apply in these types of situations is called *Respondent Superior*, which is Latin for "let the master answer."

Maryland law requires a test to determine whether this type of vicarious liability is applicable.

For example, one of the first steps in the process is to make sure that an agency relationship actually exists.



Even though there is much more to this type of analysis, this article should now make you aware that this type of liability is present under Maryland law.
